JOSEPH McLELLAN Jr., b Falmouth (Portland) 18 Apr 1762 son of Joseph & Mary (McLellan) McLellan (John A. McLellan, "Bryce McLellan (1690-1776), an Immigrant to Maine, His Children and Grandchildren" [TS, MHS, 1986], p. 10) [see JOSEPH McLELLAN (Sr.) family in this volume]: d Brunswick 27 Nov 1844 (ibid.; Doris M. Joseph Jr. began his career at the age of 13 when he joined the Falmouth privateer *Retrieve* (Paul Robeson, John Holverson and William Barry, "Portland Reflections," *Portland Evening Express*, issue of 16 Oct 1975, hereafter "Portland Reflections"). When that privateer was captured by the British, Joseph escaped at Mt. Desert (ibid.). Joseph sailed on several ships owned by his father's firm, Joseph McLellan & Sons, and was master of the Portland ship *Joseph* in 1793 when he wrote a letter from Lisbon, Portugal, to his owners about the depredations of the Barbary pirates (*Eastern Herald*, issue of 6 Jan 1794). In 1795 Joseph removed from Portland to Gray and opened a store in East Gray (George T. Hill, *History, Records, and Recollections of Gray, Maine* [1978], p. 116). While in Gray he operated a sawmill, built a house and became postmaster and a JP (ibid., p. 116, 313, although Mr. Hill errs in stating that Joseph came to Gray in the 1780-90 decade, for Joseph remained in Portland until after 1790 per USC). In 1805 Capt. McLellan (he was often called Captain, prob from his seafaring days) represented Gray at the General Court of MA and on 29 Oct 1819 he was a delegate of the town at the signing of the State of Maine constitution (ibid., p. 313). About 1823 Joseph removed to Brunswick, opened a store, became postmaster there and built a large brick house on Brunswick's Park Row (William David Barry and John Holverson, "The Revolutionary McLellans" [TS, MHS,

1977], p. 128). Throughout his years in Gray and Brunswick, Joseph was often assisted financially by his bro-in-law Daniel Stone (*ibid.*).
